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Paid Parking and Public Office Hours Suspended Until May 18th

The Plymouth Growth and Development Corporation (also known as Park Plymouth) announced today that the 2020 Paid Parking Season in Plymouth – scheduled to begin on April 1st – has been suspended until at least May 18, 2020. During that time, the Park Plymouth office located at 40 Court Street will be closed and the enforcement of parking regulations in the downtown/waterfront areas will be relaxed. These measures are being taken in response to Governor Baker's emergency order that all businesses and organizations that do not provide COVID-19 essential services be closed to all workers, customers and the public until May 18, 2020; and that there be no gatherings of more than 10 people. The PGDC will provide the public with advance notice once it is considered safe and appropriate to renew full parking operation and enforcement activities.

If you are a local business who must now rely on curbside delivery and pick-up operations, please contact the Park Plymouth office if you need assistance in managing the curb in front of your establishment. And if you are an employee or customer who works at and patronizes a business in downtown Plymouth, please respect the handicapped parking laws, and do not park in front of fire hydrants, on crosswalks, or in restricted areas and fire lanes.

There is no urgency to obtaining a **2020 parking permit** at the present time – the enforcement of all parking violations has been relaxed until further notice. If you consider it important to have a permit, however, feel free to submit your permit application and make payment by mail until the Parking Office re-opens. Finally, if you are registering your vehicle and have unpaid parking tickets issued by Park Plymouth, you are urged to **pay the ticket, any late fees, and the RMV marking fee online or by phone** so you can proceed with the RMV registration process. Park Plymouth staff will monitor ticket payments closely and will remove the RMV mark (if any) from your registration as soon as possible.
